

We read the stories in our Bibles and rejoice at our God and His amazing grace. Six years ago, I was fortunate enough to visit Israel for myself, and I was amazed at how much more vivid those stories became! 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Tuesday, Nov. 2, 2021

Our journey begins as we board our overnight flight from Houston to Tel Aviv.

Wednesday, Nov. 3

After arriving in **Tel Aviv**, our driver Moshe, will take us to our hotel near **Jaffa**.

Thursday, Nov. 4

We meet Aviv after breakfast, and we begin our tour of the historical and Biblical seaport of **Jaffa**. We then head north to **Mt. Tabor**, one of the possible sites of the Transfiguration of Jesus. We check into our hotel, Nof Ginosar, by the **Sea of Galilee**, have dinner and conclude the day with a devotional by the lake. Friday, Nov. 5

Today, we will visit several Biblical locations around the Sea of Galilee. We begin the day in **Cursi**, the site of the miracle when Jesus cast demons out of a man and into the swine. From there we go to **Corazin**, a town at the time of Jesus which was scolded by him for its unbelief. We will also stop on the shores of **Tabgah**, where Jesus fed thousands with a few fish and loaves. We conclude our day at **Mt. Arbel** where we will learn of its troubled history. After, we return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. [B,L,D]

Saturday, Nov. 6

We start our day by driving north to the ancient city of **Kedesh**, which served as the main camp for the Israelites during their wandering in the Zin Desert, (Deut. 1:46.) We visit **Tel Dan**, the northernmost city of Israel in the Old Testament. At Tel Dan we are transported thousands of years back and walk through the same gates and streets used by **Abraham** and **Lot**. Across the road from Tel Dan, we see and learn of the history of **Caesarea Philippi**, after which we will visit a local winery. We return back to our hotel by the **Sea of Galilee** for dinner and overnight. [B,L,D]





Sunday, Nov. 7

We head towards Jerusalem, stopping in **Jericho** to see the archeological excavations of the incredible city that fell to **Joshua** and the Israelites. We also visit a Hebrew farmer who grows traditional herbs including the Balsamon Tree. He will teach us how the Balm in **Gilead** was used. We continue to our hotel in **Jerusalem** where we will stay for the duration of our tour. [B,L]



Monday, Nov. 8

We begin our day in the old **City of David**. This is an active excavation site of the **Jerusalem** that Jesus would have known. We walk through the tunnels of **Hezekiah**, and end up by the **Pool of Siloam**, where Jesus told the blind man to wash himself and his sight was restored. We visit the Davidsson Center before we walk through the **Herodian Quarter** and see the **Burnt House**. [B]



Tuesday, Nov. 9

Today we enjoy a full free-day in Jerusalem. We highly recommend seeing the **Israel Museum, Holocaust Museum**, or the **Machne Yehuda market**. [B]



Wednesday, Nov. 10

We head to the low lands of **Judea** and visit **Emmaus**, where Jesus appeared to two disciples following his resurrection. We continue to the archeological and Biblical town of **Tel Gezer**, where we will peel back history. We continue our excursion to Old Testament town of **Tel Lachish**. [B,L]



Thursday, Nov. 11

Our first stop today is the **Herodium**, where we will learn of the incredible palace built by Herod. Afterwards we travel south to **Tel Arad** which sports a well preserved Israelite temple patterned after the **Temple of Solomon** in Jerusalem. Our final stop today is **Be'er Sheva**, where **Abraham** and **Abimelech** settled their differences over a well of water. [B,L]



Friday, Nov. 12

We spend the last full day in Jerusalem exploring the tunnels under the **Western Wall**, which allows us to see the construction of the Temple from various generations. We will also visit **Christ Church, the Armenian Church**, and the **Tower and David Museum**. We celebrate our tour with a group dinner at our hotel. [B,D]

Saturday, Nov. 13

We drive to the airport for our flight home to Houston.
